News From 2017 State AAUW Convention

Kathy Gervasi, Dion Bacon and Andrea Goss joined 115 women at the State Convention held in Lincoln City at Salishan Resort April 21-22nd. The Tillamook Branch was responsible for the table decorations and we thank Birgitt Jayred for her centerpieces. Kathy Gervasi was responsible for making the Convention Work Book and Andrea Goss served as the Convention Treasurer. Emily Henry and Kathy Gervasi presented a workshop on our Tech Trek Camp. Jean Mong put together a basket for the Silent Auction complete with a kayaking trip sponsored by Mary Schonbrod.

Patricia Fae Ho, National AAUW Board President AAUW Leader informed us the National AAUW projects, goals and last year's work. AAUW Headquarters will be moving and building in Washington, D.C., will be sold to save money. Attorney General Ellen F. Rosenblum, the first female attorney general in Oregon's History, talked on championing human rights and ensuring access and equal opportunity for all Oregonians. Heather Mason (a University Athletic Coach) gave an inspiring speech at the Funds/Awards Banquet of her battle in court to receive equal pay at the University of Tennessee.
